Our Club


- One club known as the "Tigers"

 - Year 4 through to 11 for Boys
 - Year 4/5, 6/7, 8/9 and 10/11/12 for Girls
- Increasing participation by girls is a key objective for CNCC

Spirit of The Game

- No sledging sledging is "anything negative said on a field which a player hears". The association will suspend players for sledging.
- Discuss any possible issues with the opposition coach/manager before the start of the game.
- Disputes with opposition teams Act reasonably and try to sort it out.
 - Deal with game day disagreements on the day
 - Report to AGC and Junior President
- Benefit of the doubt rests with batsman: LBW, catches, run outs, stumpings etc
- Every participant is responsible for ensuring the game experience for everyone involved is positive, welcoming and enjoyable.





Rules (Team Numbers)

Year 4 and 5 Boys	9	7	5
Year 4/5 and 6/7 Girls	9	7	5
Year 6 and 7 Boys	11	9	7
Year 8/9 Girls	11	9	7
Year 8, 9, 10 and 11 Boys	13	11	8
Year 10/11/12 Girls	11	9	7

- Loan players may be requested to even the team numbers in the field only
- Only supply up to the maximum number permitted in the field or the number of players on the team supplying the loan fielders
- Stage 3: Must supply up to 2, with the 3rd as discretionary.





Rules (Batting Rotations)

Age Group	Distance
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Stage 1

- Players must be rotated every game during the home and away season.
- Batting positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions. Players must bat in all
 positions before batting in a position a second time.
- Players must not bat in the same position in consecutive matches.

Stage 2 and 3

- Players must bat in a minimum of 5 different positions prior to the Christmas break.
- Players must bat in a minimum of 5 different positions after the Christmas break.
- Batting positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions.
- Any player named in the previous completed match who did not bat must bat in the following match they play.





Rules (Bowling Rotations)

Age Group Distance

Stage 1

- Players must be rotated every game during the home and away season.
- Bowling positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions. Players must bowl in all
 positions before batting in a position a second time.
- Players must not bowl in the same position in consecutive matches.

Stage 2 and 3

- Players must bowl in a minimum of 5 different positions prior to the Christmas break.
- Players must bowl in a minimum of 5 different positions after the Christmas break.
- Bowling positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions.
- Any player named in the previous completed match who did not bat must bowl in the following match they play**

We seek to educate clubs and volunteers to:

create a safe environment for children and young people at cricket clubs

understand their responsibilities under state legislation

know how to respond to inappropriate behaviour

know where to go when they need help





Safeguarding Children and Young People: See Something Say Something

- The Club follows Cricket Australia and WACA Safeguarding Kids in policies and procedures in relation to safeguarding
- Must comply with the WA Working with Children Legislation
- Safeguarding is about providing a safe, enjoyable environment for kids to play and develop their game of cricket.
- Free of bullying, harassment, inappropriate behaviour ;not exposed to conversations of an adult nature and that those conversations are not happening amongst the kids.
- Ensuring that kids are not exposed to people under the influence of drugs or alcohol whilst participating in the sport.
- Coaches and Managers play important role in setting the tone of what is acceptable and not acceptable.
- Using age appropriate training techniques.
- Recommend that you ensure that parents and players actually understand the Codes of Conduct.





Safeguarding Children and Young People: See Something Say Something

Working with Children (WWC) Check

Parent Volunteer Exemption

- Includes parent/defacto partner, prospective adoptive parent and person who has legal responsibility for the must have legal responsibility for care welfare and development of child.
- Grandparents, siblings over the age of 18, or other relatives must get WWC Check

Other Exemptions

- Child volunteers under 18; unpaid students on placement. If they are getting paid & doing child related work then they need a WWC Check.
- Working with Children Check Volunteer Declaration will be required to be completed by all coaches and managers.
- WWC Card holders will be registered through the WWC Screening Unit as associated with CNCC.
