

- Disputes with opposition teams act reasonably and try to sort it out.
- Benefit of the doubt rests with batsman: LBW, catches, run outs, stumpings etc
- Please apply the spirit of the game in all aspects of play. This includes coaches, umpires, parents, children.




Rules

 - Stage 2 Year 6 & 7 Boys, Year 8/9 Girls
 - Stage 3 Year 8, 9, 10 & 11 Boys, Year 10/11/12 Girls
- Rules that create angst:
 - LBW
 - Wides
 - No balls
 - Stumpings
 - Rotations
 - Weather-related Issues
 - Rotations

Rules (Team Numbers)

Age Group	Max	Allowed on Field	Minimum for Game
Year 4 and 5 Boys	9	7	5
Year 4/5 and 6/7 Girls	9	7	5
Year 6 and 7 Boys	11	9	7
Year 8/9 Girls	11	9	7
Year 8, 9, 10 and 11 Boys	13	11	8
Year 10/11/12 Girls	11	9	7

- Loan players may be requested to even the team numbers in the field only
- Only supply up to the maximum number permitted in the field or the number of players on the team supplying the loan fielders
- Stage 3: Must supply up to 2, with the 3rd as discretionary.





Rules (Batting Rotations)

Age Group	Distance
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Stage 1

- Players must be rotated every game during the home and away season.
- Batting positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions. Players must bat in all positions before batting in a position a second time.
- Players must not bat in the same position in consecutive matches.

Stage 2 and 3

- Players must bat in a minimum of 5 different positions prior to the Christmas break.
- Players must bat in a minimum of 5 different positions after the Christmas break.
- Batting positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions.
- Any player named in the previous completed match who did not bat must bat in the following match they play.





Rules (Bowling Rotations)

Age Group Distance

Stage 1

- Players must be rotated every game during the home and away season.
- Bowling positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions. Players must bowl in all
 positions before batting in a position a second time.
- Players must not bowl in the same position in consecutive matches.

Stage 2 and 3

- Players must bowl in a minimum of 5 different positions prior to the Christmas break.
- Players must bowl in a minimum of 5 different positions after the Christmas break.
- Bowling positions 1 & 2 are treated as separate positions.
- Any player named in the previous completed match who did not bat must bowl in the following match they play**

- Every participant is responsible for ensuring the game experience for everyone involved is positive, welcoming and enjoyable
- CJCC aim: ZERO suspensions this season
- Discuss any possible issues with the opposition coach/manager before the start of the game
- Deal with game day disagreements on the day
 - Please let your club know too
 - Who is the person at your club to inform?
 - Put brief details on the match report
- CJCC aim: To encourage positivity and the Spirit of Cricket, not punish honest mistakes
- Stage 1 Cricket: Focus on the pace of the game, drinks (not snack) breaks ON THE FIELD, keep to less than 2 minutes. Ask parents to help the coach/manager
